



What the audition entails

The BA (Hons) Music degree is unique and requires a strong commitment to working in an interdisciplinary manner with high levels of initiative and self-motivation. The audition is a two way process, aiming to offer you the opportunity to discover if the course is right for you, whilst we try to determine whether you have the experience and qualities to benefit from what we have to offer. We hope you enjoy your time with us. We will endeavour to ensure that the whole process is as positive and relaxed as possible. If at any time during the audition you want clarification on a point or other information, please ask.

Introduction to Music at LIPA

This introductory session to LIPA includes an outline of the Music course and provides you with the opportunity to ask us questions about the course.

Songwriting workshop

This is a practical songwriting workshop. Prior experience of songwriting is not necessary. Please just be prepared to engage with this workshop as fully as possible.

Tour of the building

This is a short tour of the LIPA building and the Music facilities. It is usually provided by Music students. You are not being assessed during this. We include it in the event to help give you a better insight into LIPA and our facilities.

Solo audition and interview (15 to 20 minutes)

We ask you to perform two pre-prepared pieces of your choice.

During your solo audition, we may ask you questions about your pieces or questions relevant to studying at LIPA. We may ask you to complete short musical exercises or short aural tests.

Tips for preparing your pieces:

- Please prepare **two contrasting** pieces of music.
- These should be from **contemporary genres** such as Pop, Rock, Jazz, etc.
- Avoid classical repertoire and musical theatre songs.
- These pieces should show off what you do best and reflect your abilities and personality.

If you have your own songwriting or composition experience, please make sure that at least one of the pieces is your own composition. Both pieces of music should be performed on one instrument (we count voice as an instrument). If we offer you a place at LIPA, we will offer you one-to-one tuition on the instrument that you have chosen to demonstrate to us at your audition.

Piano accompaniment

Piano accompanists can be provided for vocalists or other musicians, but you need to let the Music Admissions Officer know in advance if you require this (+44 (0)151 330 3022, k.wilson@lipa.ac.uk).

If you are using one of our piano accompanists, please bring your sheet music with you,

fully written out in the key you wish to sing. The accompanist will not transpose at sight. You can usually find sheet music in your local library or go to www.sheetmusicdirect.com

Before the audition, find someone who will play the song through for you on piano and record it so that you can keep working on it on your own. If you just buy the music of a record you have been singing along to without hearing it played, you are likely to find this part of the audition really difficult. This is because most sheet music is not written in the same key as the record. Many auditions require you to sing with a piano accompanist, so it is a challenge you will face throughout your working life, so it is useful to gain experience of preparing for them at this stage.

What to bring to the audition

Don't forget to bring your instrument, (if you are drummer you don't need to bring drumkit) and if you want to perform your two pieces with a backing track, please make sure you bring this cued up. We would recommend bringing lunch and water with you as well and something to read as there are likely to be periods when you will be waiting around.

When you will hear from us after the audition

We need time to reflect on the candidates we've seen, so we do not normally tell you the outcome of your audition on the day itself. We will, however, let you know on the audition day when you are likely to hear from us.

Unfortunately, due to the high volume of applications we receive, if you are not successful we are unable to offer feedback.
