What the interview event entails

We endeavour to ensure that the interview event is as positive and relaxed as possible. If at any time during the interview event you would like clarification on a point or other information please ask.

The interview event involves the following elements:

Test

This is a short written entrance test, which takes about 30 minutes and is held under exam conditions*.

As the course includes essay writing, general mathematics and also assumes some basic prior knowledge of the sound technology field, we feel it is appropriate to assess you in these areas as part of the interview process. This is as much for your own benefit as it is for ours.

There are twelve questions which address areas such as sound technology terminology, re-arranging simple equations, fractions, graph plotting, music production, MIDI, audio equipment and communication skills.

Group interview

These interviews are held in panels, with up to five candidates and up to two members of the Sound Technology teaching team.

They can last anywhere between one hour to one hour and 30 minutes.

You are asked both individual questions and are invited to contribute to the group discussion. You are also given the opportunity to play one recording of your portfolio and comment on it, as well as comment on the portfolios of the other candidates.

What to include in your portfolio

1. Example of your Audio CD Recording Work

Please bring an example of recorded work you have undertaken yourself, in a format that can be played on a standard audio CD player (in other words, not MP3 or WAV files on a CD-R). We generally favour recordings made outside of any course curriculum as this demonstrates initiative.

We will only have time to listen to **one** of your audio CD recordings for a maximum of four minutes. Please ensure that your CD is burnt to red book standard and that it will play correctly in a standard audio CD player. If your CD does not play correctly, we will not be able to listen to your work. So whilst you are welcome to put more than one example of your recordings on the CD so you can decide on the day what you want us to hear, please remember that we can't play anything that lasts more than four minutes.

This is played in front of the two members of staff and up to four other applicants who are taking part in the group interview. You should be prepared to talk about your role in the recording process and to answer technical questions relating to the sound production as part of a group discussion. You are invited to comment on the recording work of the other applicants during the interview process.

2. Folder containing other documentary evidence of your work

Please also bring any other documentary evidence of work you may have undertaken which you think is relevant. For example, if much of your experience has been in live, rather than recorded sound, you might wish to bring along photographs of events that you have been involved in.

When you will hear from us after the interview

We need time to reflect on the candidates we've seen, so we do not normally tell you the outcome of your interview on the day itself.

Typically, we will communicate the decision within three working weeks.
